Riverside PD Launches Crime Prevention Program for Homeowners

The Riverside Police Department, in continuation of its partnership with our community, launched a new Crime Free Program focused on reducing crime in neighborhoods. The new program, which has been piloted in the Gatewoods Subdivision since early 2016, is now launching city wide.

It is similar to a neighborhood watch program, and offers education to homeowners about crime trends and prevention tips so they can better protect themselves and their property. Considered a modern approach to the old block watch program, Life-styles brings law enforcement and residents together to build a safer community.

The program focuses on equipping families with the knowledge they need to keep themselves and their properties safe, connecting residents with their neighbors and their community, and preparing them to take action to make a difference. Did You Know?

- Real and artificial trees are fire hazards. Check holiday lights for frayed wires, replace if damaged. Keep real trees watered and away from heat sources.
- Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling, or broiling food. Do not leave home if you are baking, roasting, simmering or boiling food.
- Plug microwave ovens and other cooking appliances directly into an outlet vs. an extension cord, which could overload the circuit and cause a fire.
- Space heaters are responsible for 33% of home heating fires. Keep anything that can burn (upholstered furniture, clothing, mattresses, bedding) at least 3' away. Never leave the room or home with a space heater running.
- Poinsettias, holly, mistletoe and amaryllis are poisonous to pets. Keep them out of reach, and your vet's emergency phone number handy.

Package Theft on the Rise Over the Holidays

Riverside Police offer ways to protect your goods

As more people opt to shop online for holiday gifts, package thefts tend to increase. According to police, many of these incidents are crimes of opportunity. An offender may not set out to target your home, but if they walk or drive by and see something of value in plain sight, they can quickly steal it and go unnoticed. Thieves may also trail a delivery truck, stealing packages as they are dropped off. The good news is that there are a number of ways you can help reduce package theft. Here are a few:

- Ship your package to a location where someone you know will be available to receive it — your office or a relative, neighbor, or friend. Some shipping companies will allow you to choose a preferred time and date or even change locations when the package is in route.
- Require a signature for deliveries.
- Track your package and request an email, text, or other alert about the status of delivery.
- Consider other options like picking up at a secured location, or directly from the retail store or package carrier.
- Provide specific instructions about where the package should be left on your property, and choose a location where the items can't be seen by people walking or driving by.
- If you are going on vacation, place deliveries on hold until you return from your trip.
- If you have frequent deliveries, consider buying a locking parcel box that can be bolted down or secured.
- Report package theft immediately to the police department at 816-741-1191 and the delivery company.



If you see something or someone suspicious, call 911. Riverside Police will increase patrols during the holiday season in an effort to reduce package thefts, but also count on the public's help. A call to police last season from a Riverside resident led to the arrest of two suspects and the recovery of stolen packages from the neighborhood.


