City's Snow Removal Ranks Highest in Metro

Riverside's snow removal services outscored those of other metro communities in the recent Citizen's Satisfaction Survey, a result of preparation and diligence. Public Works begins ordering and stockpiling road salt as early as July. Equipment is serviced, mounted and checked in October. When snow and ice season begins, work commences 24/7 as official weather condition reports are monitored and crews alerted.

The City's bridges and main routes are pre-treated prior to incoming storms, and snow removal begins when accumulations reach 1.5 to 2 inches. Principal streets are plowed first, then secondary and residential streets, and finally all remaining streets. The pattern is repeated until the snow stops, after which snowplows "widen out" streets and intersections by pushing accumulated snow back toward the curb line. "We work around the clock during snowstorms to keep the streets open and passable for all," said Tom Wooddell, Director of Public Works.

Complete Home Concepts

At Home in Riverside Since 2005

You could say that Complete Home Concepts was Horizon's original tenant. Founded in 1977, the family-owned business purchased 19 acres in what would eventually become Horizons in 2005. At the time, it lacked sewer service and a completed levee, so making it a reality required a true partnership between the owners and the City.

The company, which specializes in custom mirrors, shower doors and bases, manufactured stone, fireplaces and gutter material, completed construction on their warehouse and in 2007, moved in. Soon after, the economy crashed and the construction and building trades took a hit. Complete Home Concepts felt the pinch, and slowly began phasing out its retail stores in favor of a single new showroom.

As they searched for locations, owner/founder James Goodwin, his son Jeff Goodwin and daughter Jennifer Haughenberry determined that building next to their Riverside warehouse was the best move. But it wasn't without challenges. "When you tell the Fire Marshall you want to put 40 burning fireplaces in your showroom, it raises some eyebrows," said company president Jeff Goodwin.

Good communication and teamwork made it happen. "Riverside has been wonderful, from the beginning of our development to our recent shift from a wholesale to retail operation," Jeff said. "If you have a question or need help,

they respond the next day — you just won't find that anywhere else in the metro."

The company held a soft showroom opening in August 2014, and closed the last retail store in January 2015. After the first full year in the new showroom, sales are 20% over projection. Complete Home Concepts serves customers from Warrensburg to Manhattan, St. Joe to Louisburg. The lifelong Northlanders also have clients in Riverside, including Allison and Alexander General Contractors, and the Montebella and Briarcliff subdivisions.

On Friday, Dec. 12, 39 kids arrived at Walmart excited to Shop With a Cop. Each child was given a spending limit of \$200. Though many purchased toys for themselves, some bought Christmas presents for other family members. Nearly 95% of the shoppers were from Riverside, which brings to light just how many children in our community are in need.



Spearheaded by Dispatcher Tina Hass and School Resource Officer Matt Westrich, the outing is special for the children, and equally meaningful to the police officers and firefighters involved. "One of the most heart-tugging things I see every year are the kids in desperate need of basics like clothes, and underwear in particular," said Major Skinrod. "Simply reaching into a drawer for socks and underwear just isn't a reality for them."

As the children shop for gifts and necessities, relationships are built and strengthened. Case in point: The 2015 event was the last that one shopper, a 17-year old desperately in need of several items, would be eligible for the program. Though many offered to shop with the youth, their offers were politely declined in favor of waiting nearly two hours for their own school resource officer, Matt Westrich, to do the honors. "This child's face lit up when Matt walked in and asked, 'You ready to go shopping?'" said Major Skinrod. "Shop with a Cop reminds us all how good it feels to take care of your fellow neighbor — and what a difference a few hours spent with us can make."
